Peace River Regional District - fire dispatch service

R. Zaleschuk and I. Baikie provided the board with a review of their recent trip to the Peace River Regional District, where they met with the fire chiefs and deputy fire chiefs from Fort St. John, Dawson Creek and surrounding areas. The NI 9-1-1 team were able to answer questions and provide information regarding NI 9-1-1 fire dispatch service as well as demonstrate the commonalities between their requirements and NI 9-1-1 / Campbell River Fire Department's fire dispatch technology and capabilities. The team also heard concerns related to the records management system in use, which a similar to one currently in use by a fire department in the Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District. The team felt the meeting was positive and enabled staff to reassure the Peace River fire departments that NI 9-1-1 will be able to provide fire dispatch service that meets their needs.

D. Oakman provided the board with an update regarding the Peace River Regional District's decision to move forward with the fire dispatch service agreement including all eleven fire departments.

Communication plan - abandoned call campaign

J. Steel provided a brief presentation outlining the communication plan for an abandoned call campaign scheduled for May 12, 2017. Working in collaboration with E-Comm, the 2017 campaign will focus on avoiding accidental calls to 9-1-1 and will include print and radio advertising, community posters and newsletters as well as social media posts. The communications team will work with local community emergency planning staff to reach smaller communities with fewer media options.

Due to budget constraints the 2017 campaign is focused on a specific topic to educate the public on accidental calls. Future campaigns will address other abandoned call issues.
